## **MSC Fishery Standard**



- Voluntary, 3<sup>rd</sup> party process
- Standard meets international best practice guidelines
  - ISEAL
  - UN FAO
- Evidence-based
  - Grounded in fisheries science and fisheries management best practice
  - Regularly reviewed by conservation groups, fisheries and scientists
- Three core principles
  - P1: Sustainable fish stocks
  - P2: Minimising environmental impact
  - P3: Effective management

## THE MSC FISHERIES STANDARD


The MSC Fisheries Standard brings together over 20 years of collaboration with scientists, the fishing industry and conservation groups. It reflects internationally accepted fisheries science and best practice management.

#### The three principles of the MSC Fisheries Standard

Principle 1: Sustainability of the stock: Fisheries must operate in a way that allows fishing to continue indefinitely, without over exploiting the resource.

Principle 2: Ecosystem impacts: Fishing operations need to be managed to maintain the structure, productivity, function and diversity of the ecosystem upon which the fishery depends, including other species and habitats.

Principle 3: Effective management: All fisheries need to meet all local, national and international laws and have an effective management system in place.

THE CHAIN OF CUSTODY STANDARD: DEFAULT VERSION HAS FIVE PRINCIPLES

Certified products are clearly identifiable

Certified products are separated from non-certified

Certified products are traceable and volumes are recorded








## Recent growth in MSC tuna products by species












## **Annual Volume of Products from MSC-Certified Fisheries**


## There are currently 13 MSC certified Skipjack fisheries globally:

- Weight of product sold from these fisheries has increased more than 1000-fold since 2009/10
- Increased relatively slowly between 2009/10 2012/13, before increasing more significantly year on year from then on.
- Largest increase was between 2015/16 and 2016/17 where tonnage doubled
- 42,389 of MSC-certified skipjack tuna was sold last financial year


## There are currently 14 MSC certified Albacore fisheries globally:

- Weight of product sold from these fisheries has increased steadily over the past decade
- 5,462 of MSC-certified albacore tuna was sold last financial year

N.B. nearly a 80% of reported sales last year were recorded as coming from 'multiple fisheries' making this data less representative that it could otherwise be

## **Annual Volume of Products from MSC-Certified Fisheries**






## There are currently 18 MSC certified Yellowfin fisheries globally:

- Weight of product sold from these fisheries has increased by nearly 4,500t since 2014/15
- Steady increase between 2014 2017, before doubling year on year from then on
- Largest increase was between 2017/18 and 2018/19
- 4,397t of MSC-certified yellowfin tuna was sold last financial year







- Remote attendance at site visit explicitly permitted.



- Consultation after lengthy written representations are drafted.
- 40% of objections resolved before hearing / adjudication.


#### **Update**

- Mediation and Facilitation tested in the Streamlining Pilot Process
   mediation deemed non-compatible, and facilitation requires further testing as part of the objections review.
- 40% objections resolved before hearing.
- MSC has added a consultation,
   <u>before</u> lengthy written
   representations (and associated cost/time) are started.













Twenty-seven percent of the world's tuna catch is now MSC certified, but we still receive many questions about sustainable tuna. MSC created the Sustainable Tuna Handbook as a reference guide for partners to understand the complexity in tuna supply chains and to help buyers make sustainable choices. The Handbook explores fishing gears, techniques and management issues in tuna sourcing, and profiles MSC certified fisheries.





#### Buy with confidence:

Traceability from ocean to plate, preventing illegal fishing and mislabeling.

Independent certification bodies regularly check the fishery against the MSC Standard, which is developed by experts and with international consultation.

Certified fisheries support healthy ecosystems, with low levels of non-target catch.
